Blessed Gianna expert to give presentation at St. Peter the Apostle - The President of the society of Blessed Gianna, Mr. Joseph Cunningham, will give a presentation on the life and sanctification of Blessed Gianna Molla, on Thursday, April 22, 2004 at 7:00 p.m. in the Social Hall of St. Peter the Apostle Church, Fifth and Harmony Streets in historic New Castle, Delaware. Pope John Paul II will canonize blessed Gianna, wife, mother and medical doctor, as one of the newest saints of the Catholic Church in May. Blessed Gianna Molla died in 1962 as a martyr of maternal love. In September of 1961, at the age of 39, Blessed Gianna was pregnant with her fourth child when physicians diagnosed a large uterine tumor, which required surgery. The surgeon suggested that Gianna undergo an abortion in order to save her own life. Gianna's decision was prompt and decisive: "I shall accept whatever they will do to me provided they save the child." She underwent the surgery but her fate was sealed. The following year, on Good Friday, Gianna was admitted to Monza Maternity Hospital. Her daughter, Gianna Emanuela, was born the next day but Blessed Gianna expired seven days later, on April 28, 1962.

Mr. Cunningham's presentation will include a short video containing footage of the daughter for which Blessed Gianna gave her life and interviews with her husband and other children. Relics of Blessed Gianna will also be on hand for viewing and reflection. The presentation is free and open to the public. More information is available by calling Mary DiMenco at 302-328-0771.
