Regarding **Godparents** – ideally both Godparents should be Catholic, however, church law states that one Godparent **must be** a practicing Catholic, at least 16 years of age and must have been confirmed. If the Godparent is married, a priest must have witnessed the marriage. The Catholic Godparent(s) must obtain a Sponsor Certificate from the church where he/she is registered stating that this person meets the criteria for being a Godparent. The second person, if not Catholic, is considered a Christian Witness. The Christian Witness must be a baptized person.

Wednesday, February 9th is *Ash Wednesday*, the beginning of the Lenten Season. Masses will be celebrated and ashes blessed on Ash Wednesday at the 8 a.m. Mass and the 6:30 p.m. Mass. Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and

abstinence. During this holy season of prayer and self-denial we prepare for our eternal Easter. Let us pray for each other that we may have a fruitful Lent that truly we experience in our individual and family lives the joy of the Paschal Mystery.

Lenten Schedule: Daily Mass 8:00 a.m.

Stations of the Cross will be on Friday morning after the 8:00 a.m. Mass.

Confessions are heard on Saturday and Sunday before the 5 p.m. and 9 a.m. Masses. Confessions will be heard during the week upon request.

Operation Rice Bowl – monies saved from eating penitential meals during the holy season of Lent will be collected on Palm Sunday and shared with those less fortunate than us.

Fast – three meals; one major meal, two lesser meals and no eating in between. Binds those until your 59th birthday.

Abstinence – No meat allowed (on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays during Lent). This binds those 14 years of age and older.
