## WORD OF GOD FOR A SUNDAY:

Bread broken reveals a Lord risen to disciples whose hearts were first fired with faith and heated with hope. Only hearts so prepared can see the Lord of life.

## THE READINGS:

Acts 2:14, 22-23

Here is a sermon from the early church preaching the good news of Jesus' resurrection.

#### 1 Peter 1:17-21

More precious than silver and gold is the salvation Christ has won for us through death and resurrection.

#### Luke 24:13-35

The Church draws her life from Christ in the Eucharist; by him she is fed and by him she is enlightened. The Eucharist is both a mystery of faith and a "mystery of light." Whenever the Church celebrates the Eucharist, the faithful can in some way relive the experience of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus: "Their eyes were opened and they recognized him" (Lk 24:31).

Each day my faith has been able to recognize in the consecrated bread and wine the divine Wayfarer who joined the two disciples on the road to Emmaus and opened their eyes to the light and their hearts to new hope (cf. Luke 24:13-35) *Pope John Paul II* Ecclesia de Eucharistia, 6, 59
