...The Church is apostolic in the sense that she "continues to be taught, sanctified, and guided by the apostles until Christ's return, through their successors in pastoral office: the college of bishops, assisted by priests, in union with the successor of Peter, the Church's supreme pastor." (Catechism of the Catholic Church No. 857) Succession to the apostles in the pastoral mission necessarily entails the sacrament of Holy Orders, that is, the uninterrupted sequence, from the very beginning of valid episcopal ordinations. This succession is essential for the Church to exist in a proper and full sense.
