WORD OF GOD FOR A SUNDAY:

In today's Gospel we hear about those who appear to be righteous, but who are not humble enough to hear and obey the Lord. Let us allow ourselves to be challenged by the Gospel and ask for mercy for those times when we failed to heed the Word of the Lord.

The ecclesial communion of the Eucharistic assembly is a communion with its own **bishop** and with the **Roman Pontiff**. The bishop, in effect, is the **visible** principle and the foundation of unity within his particular Church. It would therefore be a great contradiction if the sacrament **par excellence** of the Church's unity were celebrated without true communion with the bishop...Likewise, since "the Roman Pontiff, as the successor of Peter, is the perpetual and visible source and foundation of the unity of the bishops and of the multitude of the faithful," communion with him is intrinsically required for the celebration of the Eucharistic Sacrifice.
