Solemnity of Christ the King

### WORD OF GOD FOR A SUNDAY:

Today we celebrate Jesus Christ as our King. We are his subjects. In the Gospel, Jesus tells us how we will be judged at the end of our life. Let us ready ourselves to listen as subjects listen to the command of their king. Let us listen as if our lives depended on it.

#### THE READINGS:

Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17 - The shepherd who will judge between one sheep and another.

1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28 In the end Christ will hand over his kingdom to God the Father.

#### Matthew 25:31-46

In celebrating the sacrifice of the Lamb, we are united to the heavenly "liturgy" and become part of that great multitude which cries out: "Salvation belongs to our God who sits upon the throne, and to the Lamb! (Rev 7:10). The Eucharist is truly a glimpse of heaven appearing on earth. A significant consequence of the eschatological tension inherent in the Eucharist is also the fact that it spurs us on our journey through history and plants a seed of living hope in our daily commitment to the work before us. We need but think of the urgent need to work for peace, to base relationships between peoples on solid premises of justice and solidarity, and to defend human life from conception to its natural end.
