The Sacrament of Baptism – if you are expecting a child, you should call the office to arrange a meeting with Father for a Baptism Class (if it is your first child). Regarding **Godparents** – ideally both Godparents should be Catholic, however, church law states that one Godparent **must be** a practicing Catholic, at least 16 years of age and must have been confirmed. If the Godparent is married, a priest must have witnessed the marriage. The Catholic Godparent(s) must obtain a Sponsor Certificate from the church where he/she is registered stating that this person meets the criteria for being a Godparent. The second person, if not Catholic, is considered a Christian Witness. The Christian Witness must be a baptized person.
