**The Diocesan Family Life Bureau presents "Making the Most Out of Retirement"**, presented by Gene Stecca. This workshop explores retirement options and issues (financial issues are not discussed). It looks at retirement as a "career" step; a time when you have the freedom to plan and do what you (and your partner) want to do with this phase of your life. The human life cycle is examined as well as paradigms, myths and misconceptions about retirement. There is an attitude and a readiness assessment. Financial readiness is NOT considered in this workshop but is clearly a critical assessment that can be examined with a financial planner. This program involves a process of exploring the human side of "making the most out of retirement." Registration forms are located on the table in the vestibule.
