Anointing of the Sick & Communion to the Sick – As you know we have permission to celebrate the Feasts of Ss. Peter & Paul this weekend, however, the Bringing Home the Word speaks of the Gospel that would have been used if we didn't have permission. It speaks about healing of the Synagogue official's daughter and the woman who was plagued for many years by hemorrhaging. Jesus makes present to us His ministry through the Sacraments. He wishes to be present to all of us through the Anointing of the Sick, which is a prayer for those who have an illness, which if not treated, could lead to death it is also a preparation for going to heaven if the person is close to death.

Many illnesses are treatable, i.e. appendicitis, some cancers, strokes, etc. You can be anointed before going into the hospital for a scheduled surgery. Also age or the condition of the person can make some minor surgeries serious. If at all possible the Sacrament is to be given while you are conscious. If for some reason you need to receive the Sacrament and are unconscious if you have previously expressed to God you want to receive the Sacrament it would be valid. The other reminder is, the reception of Anointing of the Sick does not mean that you in imminent danger of death.

If you go to any hospital in an emergency situation you need to realize that the hospital personnel even though they may believe that your spiritual and physical health are connected, they have the responsibility to take care of your physical condition first and they may not have the time to call the Chaplain or any priest. Also, because the situation could be very stressful the records that tell them you are a member of this parish may not follow you.

Sometime later if you go to the hospital it is important that you or your family make sure that you are registered as a Catholic and the parish you belong to. This way the Chaplain will be able to find you, the Eucharistic Ministers attached to the hospital will bring you Communion. The only hospital that informs us that a parishioner is in the hospital is Christiana Care. They call us on Mondays. If you go into the hospital after their call, we wouldn't hear again until the following Monday.

If you are homebound and not able to attend Mass on a regular basis, please call the parish office. Eucharistic Ministers or I will be happy to bring Communion to you.
