Year of the Priest - On Tuesday, July 28th, at 7 p.m. in the Church, there will be a **Holy Hour**, which will be done in all our parishes of our Diocese. Pope Benedict has declared this the Year of the Priest, which is a time for us to pray for priests and deacons as well vocations to the priesthood and diaconate.

Since this is the year we are to pray for vocations, we will be reinstituting the program we used asking parishioners to take a chalice home with them, keeping it in a prominent place and praying with their family that week for vocations. I would ask you to seriously think about doing this because the need is great and becoming even greater finding people who will serve us as priests. I am urging everybody to take a week to sign up to take the chalice home and pray. This will be beginning in mid August.

I will be going on vacation and on the weekend of August 8/9, a missionary priest, Fr. Saju Antony of the Vincentian Congregation – Mary Matha Province in Kerala, India will be here to speak on behalf of their missions. Fr. Antony will celebrate Masses for me that weekend. This is our semi-annual missionary Sunday when a visitor comes in to preach. Please make him feel welcome and be as generous as you can.
