

abstinence from meat and also days of fast. *Fast* – three meals, one major meal, two lesser meals and no eating in between. This binds those who are 18 years and who are not yet 59 years old. *Abstinence* – No meat allowed (on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays during Lent). This binds those 14 years of age and above. Abstinence is recommended for all Fridays of the year and outside of Lent if you wish to choose some other type of penance you may.

Exemption from fast and abstinence for health reasons or circumstances beyond your control is permitted.

What does the church say about the rest of the year? The Church highly recommends we abstain from meat on Fridays; however, it gives permission for each individual to choose a different penance on that day. **Stations of the Cross** will be said on the Fridays during Lent at 7 p.m. Stations will be said on Good Friday at 3 p.m.

Operation Rice Bowl starts Ash Wednesday, March 9. Each Lent, parishioners and schoolchildren in more than 12,000 communities use symbolic rice bowls as the focal point of their prayer and fasting. Participants prepare a small meatless meal each week of Lent and place the money that would have been spent on a big meal in the rice bowl to support Catholic Relief Services' work to fight hunger and poverty. Of the more than \$6 million that was raised last year, 75 percent was used for CRS projects in 40 countries. The remaining 25 percent stayed in U.S. dioceses to support food pantries and soup kitchens. "Operation Rice Bowl provides Catholics with 40 days of making a real difference in the lives of people struggling with hunger and poverty," says Beth Martin, program manager for Operation Rice Bowl.
