*In today's Gospel,* Christ uses two parables to describe the kingdom of God. The kingdom he invites us to is a simple and peaceful one. It is open to all who seek it with a sincere heart. The easiest way to enter into it is by sowing a seed faith in Christ. This is the key.

In the second parable, the mustard seed which is the smallest seed refers to our faith. *"If you have faith like a grain of mustard seed...nothing will be impossible for you" (Mt 17, 20).* This includes entering the kingdom of God.

Faith grows and when it does, it achieves great things. As it grows, it leads us to Christ and consequently to his kingdom. Also, our faith draws others to Christ and to his church, the visible sign of God's kingdom on earth. As Christ says: *"The birds of the air come to take shelter under its branches."* 

These may seem to be insignificant achievements, but the seed is growing. This, consequently, leads to the growth of the church, the visible sign of God's kingdom on earth.
