**Today's gospel from John** is centered on the first miracle of Jesus Christ. This miracle was a product of Christ's generosity. Although, it was not yet time for Christ to commence his public ministry, he generously accepted to help out with his gift of miracle. Through this, Christ taught us that we should use our gifts for the good and growth of God's people.

Also, another important lesson we should learn from today's gospel is the role the Blessed Virgin Mary played in this miracle. She had the gift of intercession. She knew that her son will not refuse her anything good. So, she interceded on behalf of her people. They only price she demanded was their obedience to the commands of Christ.

She did not need to demand for anything more than this, because, she knew that her gift of intercession and position as the Mother of Christ was a free gift from God for the edification of her people. Therefore, by using her position and gift of intercession very well, Mary participated effectively in the mission and ministry of Christ.
