Lenten Reminder - On Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent: Everyone of age 14 and up must abstain from consuming meat. On Good Friday: Everyone of age 18 to 59 must fast, unless exempt due to usually a medical reason. Good Friday is one of two yearly days of obligatory fasting and abstinence for Roman Catholics. Fasting means a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but they are not to equal that of a full meal.
