**Restoration Project continuing during November** - St Paul's has contracted with Ted Hooven & Son to perform some much-needed restoration work to the interior of our church. The project will include repairing large cracks, cleaning and protection of the interior wood ceiling and painting. The Parish will pay for this work out of our FY 2023 operating funds and will not need to borrow or use our investments. As a contingency plan, we will make use of the Parish Hall for Mass if necessary. We thank you, the parishioners of St. Paul's, for your generosity and stewardship that has allowed us to undertake these improvements. More information will be provided in the forthcoming weeks.

**During this time of giving, a QCD from your IRA is a great way to give back to your church** - The IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) allows taxpayers 70 ½ or older to donate up to \$100,000 from their individual retirement accounts (IRAs) directly to charitable nonprofits. When a taxpayer reaches age 72 (old rule 70 ½) they have to withdraw a required minimum distribution (RMD) from their IRA each year, which is taxable income. However, if the taxpayer donates up to \$100,000 of their RMD to a qualified charity, via a QCD, the RMD is not taxable income, which could be more beneficial than getting the charitable deductions for the actual donation. Please contact your tax or financial advisor to discuss further how this could benefit you.
